Story of Hope

Matt H. knows a thing or two about the kindness of strangers. He credits many of them with helping him emerge out of despair and addiction. Matt is a Veteran of the U.S Navy, who served in posts all over the world. He was in south Texas looking to start over after a painful divorce. Turned out his best friend from high school lived in Bend. Matt got here, got work and ran smack into Bend's housing prices. He stayed in a motel for a while burning through what little cash he had. Insult to injury, he wrecked his car. He got in touch with COVO (Central Oregon Veterans Outreach) where a kind stranger named Allison told him about Bethlehem Inn. With no car, Matt called a taxi. Another stranger named Danny picked Matt up, found out he was now a homeless vet, refused to take his money, drove him to Jake's Diner, a popular eatery with vets and then on to Bethlehem Inn. Enter a whole raft of strangers, the staff of the Inn. Matt was struck by the kindness and support from everyone. He also got the Inn staff's message, loud and clear: "Look for work. Look for housing. You do the work. We'll help."

Which they did: stronger connections with veterans support groups, leads on work. Matt did well...until he didn't. He didn't stay sober and had to leave the Inn. But after a stretch of once again being clean and sober, he returned to the Inn. This time, Matt was all in. And the Inn staff was always there to help and encourage. He got in touch with yet another stranger, a woman named Mary at the VA who helps vets with housing challenges. He now has an apartment. He's been clean and sober for nearly three years and has just started working in a counseling position at one of the region's premier drug and alcohol treatment programs. In that job, Matt is now doing what others did for him: being a stranger who helps others find their way to a better life.

At Bethlehem Inn, volunteers play an essential role in creating a warm and welcoming space for our residents. This month, we're thrilled to shine the spotlight on the Newcomers Club of Bend (NCOB) and their dedicated meal-serving group, the INNcomparable Cooks. Their commitment to service has been a meaningful part of our community for over a decade.



### What is NCOB?

The Newcomers Club of Bend is a social organization open to all, whether they are new to Bend or simply looking to build connections and explore new activities. In 2013, NCOB members decided to add a service element to their social calendar, leading them to Bethlehem Inn, where they formed the INNcomparable Cooks.

### A Tradition of Giving

Over the past 12 years, NCOB has maintained an active presence in our kitchen. Their volunteer-driven cooking groups, each consisting of about ten members, prepare and serve meals every three months. The groups are entirely self-funded, with members contributing toward meal costs, and many of the original volunteers from 2013 are still serving today!

### **More Than Just a Meal**

Beyond nourishing meals, the INNcomparable Cooks bring creativity and camaraderie to Bethlehem Inn. One group, led by Mimi, has turned their small but mighty team into a well-oiled machine, forming deep friendships with each other and the Inn's staff.

"We don't think we could manage in the kitchen without the illustrious, cheerful, and calm Elijah," Mimi shared. "He makes us feel like we actually know what we're doing!"

Their mealtimes come with a touch of extra care, decorating tables with colorful tablecloths to brighten the dining experience. Residents often ask if a special occasion is being celebrated, to which the group happily replies, "We just wanted to make it a bit more cheerful, every meal can feel like a party!"
