Story of Hope

Former resident Mel calls Bethlehem Inn "home...until you can find a permanent home." Mel came to Bend from the Oregon Coast to escape an abusive relationship. A plan to live with a relative fell through and Mel and her five kids found themselves in a motel she couldn't afford.

Money and hope were running out when she heard about Bethlehem Inn. She says, "When you hear 'shelter,' you think 'bunk beds...dark... dreary.' "The Inn was an eye-opening experience.



"My kids' eyes lit up when they saw our room and started running around and picking their beds." Inn staff, working with the Family Access Network Advocate, made sure the kids stayed in the schools were they were known and comfortable. Mel had been a stay-at-home mom for years. She was painfully shy and landed a job that would mean all-day contact with the public. With encouragement from Inn staff and co-workers, she met the challenge with grit and grace. Next up: finding housing. "No one will take me with five kids," she thought. But she kept at it and with guidance from Inn staff and NeighborImpact, she now has a house of her own. The kids, in Mel's words, "...are thriving." Mel came to the Inn, "...like a door mouse...shy...scared." She has grown and flourished. She says she has found her voice and her strength and, with a lot of thanks to Bethlehem Inn, a promising future.

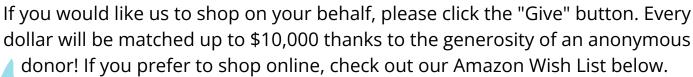
